Summary of findings

Overall summary

Manorfields Residential Care Home is a residential home registered to provide care for up to 40 people. The service provides care to older people, some of whom are living with dementia. At the time of our inspection there were a total of 35 people using the service.

We found the following examples of good practice:

The layout and design of the premises could be used to effectively manage and reduce any onward transmission from infection should there be an outbreak.

Cleaning routines were followed and included frequent cleaning of regularly touched surfaces so that the cleanliness of the location was maintained.

Procedures were followed to ensure COVID-19 tests were conducted in line with the latest advice to the service.

Policies and risk assessments were in place to help manage and reduce the risks associated with COVID-19 for people and staff.

Staff had designated rooms for changing their uniform and putting on and taking off their personal protective equipment. (PPE). Adequate supplies of PPE and hand hygiene products and facilities were available throughout the premises for staff to use. The registered manager told us they would continue to complete checks on staffs' use of PPE to ensure they used it in line with guidance.

Visiting arrangements were planned to reduce the risks from infection transmission. Checks were in place and carried out to reduce the risk of infection from any visitors to the location. The registered manager told us they would review the recording of these to ensure all checks were recorded. Visiting guidelines and policies were up to date with the latest government guidance.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of COVID-19, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice is safe and that services are compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place. We also asked the provider about any staffing pressures the service was experiencing and whether this was having an impact on the service.

This inspection took place on 18 January 2022 and was announced. We gave the service one days' notice of the inspection.

• The provider told us they had measures in place to mitigate the risks associated with COVID-19 related staff pressures

How well are people protected by the prevention and control of infection?

- We were assured that the provider was promoting safety through the layout and hygiene practices of the premises.
- We were assured that the provider was making sure infection outbreaks can be effectively prevented or managed.
- We were assured that the provider's infection prevention and control policy was up to date.
- We were assured the provider was facilitating visits for people living in the home in accordance with the current guidance.
- We were assured that the provider was meeting shielding and social distancing rules.
- We were assured that the provider was admitting people safely to the service.
- We were assured that the provider was accessing testing for people using the service and staff.

From 11 November 2021 registered persons must make sure all care home workers and other professionals visiting the service are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, unless they have an exemption or there is an emergency.

• The service was meeting the requirement to ensure non-exempt staff and visiting professionals were vaccinated against COVID-19.
