Overall summary

We carried out an announced comprehensive inspection at The Bromley Common Practice on 15 January 2019 as part of our inspection programme. We previously carried out an announced comprehensive inspection at The Bromley Common Practice on 3 March 2016.

Our inspection team

Background to The Bromley Common Practice

The Bromley Common Practice is located at the Crown Medical Centre, 3 Mackintosh Street, Bromley, BR2 9GT.

The provider is registered with CQC to deliver the Regulated Activities; diagnostic and screening procedures, family planning, maternity and midwifery services, surgical procedures and treatment of disease, disorder or injury.

Bromley Common Practice is situated within the NHS Bromley CCG and provides services to approximately 9,800 patients under the terms of a general medical services (GMS) contract. This is a contract between general practices and NHS England for delivering services to the local community.

The provider is a partnership of five GPs, three female and two male. The practice was registered with the CQC in April 2013. *There are two nurses. The practice is part of the Bromley GP Alliance Limited a wider network of GP practices.* The practice age profile is similar to that nationally. However, there are more young families with children than nationally. The percentage of people in employment in the practice area is higher than local and national averages. The National General Practice Profile states that 87% of the practice population are white, the remainder spread fairly evenly amongst Asians, black and mixed race peoples. Information published by Public Health England, rates the level of deprivation within the practice population group as seven, on a scale of one to ten, where level one represents the highest levels of deprivation. Male life expectancy is 79 years which is the national average. Female life expectancy is 83 years which again is the national average.
