#### Overall summary

Beech Tree House is a residential care home which provides accommodation and personal care for up to 31 older people, including people living with dementia. At the time of the inspection there were 28 people living at the home.

We found the following examples of good practice:

The team continued to review, implement and follow best practice guidance to keep people safe.

A documented ongoing testing regime was in place for visitors, staff and people living in the home.

All areas of the home were subject to regular and enhanced cleaning regimes. The home was clean, uncluttered and odour free.

The home had several homely areas where people could sit and relax, this allowed for comfortable social distancing.

### Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.
