## Summary of findings

#### **Overall summary**

RecoveryHub@East Leeds is a 'care home'. People in care homes receive accommodation and nursing or personal care as single package under one contractual agreement. The service was supporting 18 people at the time of inspection.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The service was accessing the government testing scheme which had assisted them to identify an outbreak quickly.

The home was clean and well ventilated.

There was clear signage available on entry and throughout the home reinforcing infection control procedures. One member of staff said," We have a culture of good practice."

Staff followed good hand hygiene procedures and wore PPE appropriately. One person said, "Yes its always clean and they [staff] always wear a mask."

The registered manager and staff were assisting people to keep in contact with their families and were in the process of purchasing a pod for the home to enable social distancing visits. This also included a pergola for the garden.

## Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 2 December 2020 and was announced.
