Summary of findings

Overall summary

Widmore Road provides a respite service and emergency support and accommodation for up to 12 people with learning disabilities at any one time. There were five people using the service at the time of our visit.

We found the following examples of good practice.

Staff had access to the PPE they needed to support people safely whilst minimising the risk of the spread of infection. They understood how to put on and take off PPE safely, in line with national guidelines.

Staff worked to ensure they and the people they supported were socially distanced whilst at the service. The provider had screening procedures in place for any visitors to the service and followed national guidance when admitting people to the service to reduce infection risks.

Friends and relatives were unable to visit the service at the time of our inspection, but people were able to maintain contact with their loved ones and take part in group activities with friends using video conferencing technology.

People and staff were routinely tested for COVID-19 and the registered manager understood the action to take to effectively manage a potential outbreak, should one occur. Staff received infection control training and followed safe hygiene practice whilst working. The home was regularly cleaned to help minimse the risk of infection spread.

The provider had infection prevention and control policies in place which were up to date and reflective of national guidelines.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

We received information of concern about infection control and prevention measures at this service. This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 26 January 2021 and was unannounced.
