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Overall summary

During our announced comprehensive inspection of this practice on 14 September 2017 we found breaches of legal requirements of to the Health and Social Care Act 2008 in relation to:

- Regulation 17 Good Governance
- Regulation 19 Fit and Proper Persons employed

We undertook this focused inspection to check that the provider now met legal requirements. This report only covers our findings in relation to these requirements. Our findings

Governance arrangements

At our previous inspection in September 2017 we found a shortfall in the practice's governance and recruitment procedures that showed it was not well led.

During this inspection we noted the following significant improvement had been implemented since then:

The practice's recruitment procedures were suitable and the recruitment arrangements were in line with Schedule 3 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 (Regulated Activities) Regulations 2014 to ensure necessary employment checks were in place for all staff and the required specified information in respect of persons employed by the practice was held.

Risk assessments had been carried out for electrical and gas safety, needle stick injuries and protection from blood borne virus for those clinical staff without Hep B immunity.

Staff training records were collated to assess the status of individual staff competency and staff appraisals were being carried out.
