Summary of findings

Overall summary

Ashfield Nursing and Residential Home is nursing home in Wetherby providing nursing and residential care for up to 32 people. Accommodation is spread across three floors in an adapted building with gardens. At the time of the inspection 21 people were living in the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

A range of visiting options were available to people. This included garden visits, pod visits and internal visits subject to testing. A separate visitor entrance was in place to reduce the risk of transmission. People had visiting care plans in place detailing how their loved ones visited them.

Clear risk assessments were in place to help reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission in the home. These were well understood by staff. People, staff and relatives were provided with regular communication about the facts of COVID-19 including testing and vaccination to reduce the risk of misinformation through social media influencing people's views.

The registered manager was knowledgeable about government guidance and systems were in place to promptly communicate any changes in guidance to staff to ensure they followed the latest infection prevention practices.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to the COVID-19 pandemic we are looking at the preparedness of care homes in relation to infection prevention and control. This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place.
