Ardtully Residential Home is a residential care home providing personal and nursing care for up to 23 people aged 65 and over. At the time of inspection 22 people were using the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- The service had provided a safe space for people to continue to receive visitors.
- The service was clean and hygienic and systems were in place for cleaning to be carried out regularly.
- The provider followed good practice guidance to support the safe admission of people into the service.
- Staff were trained in using PPE and the service had designated areas for staff to put on and remove PPE. The service disposed of PPE safely.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 10 March 2021 and was announced.
