Summary of findings

Overall summary

Aberford Hall is a care home service for up to 41 older people that may require nursing care and support. The home is split over two floors with people requiring nursing on the both floors. At the time of this inspection 30 people were living at this service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- Visitors had to have their temperature checked on entry.
- We observed staff wearing personal protective equipment in the home. One person we spoke with said, "Yes, staff wear it all the time." One member of staff told us, "If I saw a member of staff not wearing a mask properly, I would tell them. I haven't needed to though."
- Staff had completed infection control training and told us they felt supported by their colleagues and manager.
- People and staff had access to regular COVID-19 testing.
- People's wellbeing was managed well around COVID-19. People had their own activity box in their rooms where staff supported people on a one to one basis. Staff communicated with families and sent pictures through with letters attached to let loved ones know how they were doing.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.
