Summary of findings

Overall summary

Mansion House is a nursing home providing personal and nursing care for up to 29 older people who may be living with a physical disability or dementia. When we inspected, 20 people were using the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- The service and any equipment used were regularly cleaned to minimise the risk of people catching or spreading COVID-19.
- Measures had been put in place to support social distancing. Staff travelled to work separately and staggered their breaks; furniture had been rearranged to encourage people to socially distance themselves.
- Staff received training on infection prevention control, hand hygiene and appropriate use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). There were good supplies of PPE, which staff used appropriately to help keep people safe.
- There were safe areas where staff could put on, take off and dispose of PPE.
- People who used the service and staff were regularly tested and there were clear procedures in place to make sure people self-isolated when necessary.
- A visitor's policy and procedure helped minimise the risks associated with visitors to the service. Alternative arrangements had been made to support people to maintain social contact to reduce social isolation.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 9 November 2020 and was announced.
