Laurel Mount is a nursing home. At the time of the inspection they were providing personal and nursing care to 18 people aged 65 and over. The service can support up to 34 people.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The premises were clean. Hand sanitisers and personal protective equipment (PPE) stations were situated throughout the building.

Staff were observed wearing appropriate PPE. There was prominent signage and instructions to explain what everyone should do to ensure safety regarding infection control.

The service had effective systems in place to ensure everyone was socially distancing.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures.
