Summary of findings

Overall summary

Peldon Campus provides care and support for four people in supported living accommodation. In addition to this, 16 people living on the campus live in a residential care home. People living on Peldon Campus have learning disabilities.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- The service had provided a safe space for people to continue to receive visitors.
- There was a booking system in place to stagger visitors and visiting times to minimise numbers and ensure social distancing could be maintained.
- The provider followed guidance to support the safe admission of people into the service.
- Staff were trained in using Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and the service had designated areas for staff to put on and remove PPE. The service disposed of PPE safely.
- Cleaning schedules were in place.
- To mitigate the impact of isolation, meaningful activities are provided.
- The registered manager saw routine and regular testing of staff, people and visitors as vital, especially with the risk of asymptomatic spread.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 17 March 2021 and was announced.
