Summary of findings

Overall summary

Beverley Park Nursing Home provides nursing and residential care for up to 18 older adults. At the time of this visit, 12 people were living at the home.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

We found the following examples of good practice:

A bespoke covid-secure 'visitors pod' had been constructed within the grounds of the home. The pod could only be accessed by visitors externally and they were not required to enter the care home.

Staff confidently demonstrated the use of personal protective equipment (PPE), including correct means of disposal.

Handwashing facilities were accessible throughout the building. Hand sanitiser was also provided. Relevant guidance was displayed.

The home was well ventilated and visibly clean; regular cleaning procedures were in place to minimise the risk of infection.

Whilst this inspection visit was centred around IPC practice, during our inspection visit a relative of a resident who had recently passed away telephoned the home and asked to speak with us. They provided feedback in respect of the care and support their relative had received. They described the care as "wonderful" and that its was "like visiting my own family home each and every time I visited."

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.
