# Summary of findings

## Overall summary

Britannia Care Home is a residential care home for up to 39 people who have mental health needs. There were 29 people using the service when we visited. This included two people in hospital.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The home was clean and well ventilated, with regular regimes in place to prevent the spread of infection.

Clear signs were in place to reinforce infection control procedures.

Staff wore personal protective equipment (PPE) appropriately.

Staff handovers included updates on the latest guidance for managing COVID 19.

People who needed to isolate in their bedrooms were provided with 'Goody bags' which included treats to eat and items to help them pass the time such as magazines and DVD's.

## **Detailed findings**

### Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of the Care Quality Commission (CQC) response to care homes with outbreaks of coronavirus, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 26 November 2020 and was announced.
