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Summary of findings

Overall summary

Stanton Manor is a care home providing personal care for up to 29 people. At the time of the inspection 28 people were living at the home. The accommodation consists of a large house, and a smaller home in the grounds where eight people lived.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The home was clean and domestic staff were visible around the home.

People were admitted to the service safely. Individuals risk assessments were in place to consider the impact of COVID-19 on individual health conditions.

Staff were up to date with infection, prevention and control (IPC) training and we observed good IPC practice throughout the inspection.

Staff and people using the service participated in the testing programme.

People using the service were supported to receive regular visits from family and friends.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to care homes with outbreaks of COVID-19, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) practice is safe and that services are compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place. We also asked the provider about any staffing pressures the service was experiencing and whether this was having an impact on the service.

This inspection took place on 21 March 2022 and was unannounced.

- The provider told us they had measures in place to mitigate the risks associated with COVID-19 related staff pressures

- We were assured that the provider was preventing visitors from catching and spreading infections.
