## Quality Report

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Date of inspection visit: We have not revisited Milton Surgery as part of this review because Milton Surgery were able to demonstrate that they were meeting the standards without the need for a visit.

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# Summary of findings

## The five questions we ask and what we found

We always ask the following five questions of services.

### **Are services safe?**

At the last inspection in August 2014 we had one concern because not all repeat prescriptions had been signed by a GP prior to medicines being given to patients.

Since the last inspection the provider had taken appropriate action to ensure that all repeat prescriptions were monitored and were signed prior to medicines being issued to patients. This action had protected patients against the risks associated with the management of medicines.

## Detailed findings

### Why we carried out this inspection

As a result of the last inspection in August 2014 we had one minor concern and made a compliance action. This was made because the provider had not always ensured that repeat prescription forms were always signed by a GP prior to medicines being issued to patients.

We have followed up to make sure that the necessary changes have been made and found the provider is now meeting the standard included within this report. This

report should be read in conjunction with the full inspection report for August 2014. We have not revisited Milton Surgery as part of this review because Milton Surgery were able to demonstrate that they were meeting the standards without the need for a visit.

## Our findings

### Medicine management

At the last inspection in August 2014 we had one concerns because not all repeat prescriptions had been signed by a GP prior to medicines being given to patients.

Since the last inspection we received an action plan from the provider informing us of the action they had taken to

become compliant. The provider confirmed that they had taken appropriate action to ensure that all repeat prescriptions were signed prior to medicines being issued to patients.

The provider had also taken action to regularly monitor the management of repeat prescriptions alongside their existing monitoring of medicines. This action had ensured that patients were protected against the risks associated with the management of medicines.
