Summary of findings

Overall summary

Medlock Court provides short stay accommodation and enablement support for up to 32 people. Medlock Court is a large, single storey, purpose built building that is accessible for people with restricted mobility.

We found the following examples of good practice:

- The laundry system was very safe, including the use of double bagging, lidded containers and direct access to the laundry without crossing other areas.
- Signage throughout the home was clearly visible, with concise instructions and guidance.
- People were supported with multi-disciplinary teams to reach their baseline as soon as possible and return home when safe to do so.

We were assured that this service met good infection prevention and control guidelines as a designated care setting.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place. As part of CQC's response to the coronavirus pandemic we are conducting a review of infection control and prevention measures in care homes.

The service had been identified for use by the Local Authority as a designated care setting in response to the Winter Plan for people discharged from hospital with a positive Covid-19 status. The inspection was to ensure that the service was compliant with infection control and prevention measures.

This inspection took place on 30 October 2020 and was announced.
