## Summary of findings

#### Overall summary

Twelve Trees care home provides care and support for up to 34 older people, some of whom are living with dementia. There were 34 people living at the service when we visited.

We found the following examples of good practice.

The service had signage displayed on all external doors to alert visitors to restrictions on entering the building and the infection control measures they would need to take.

Staff had completed training in infection control, COVID-19 and donning and doffing personal protective equipment (PPE). The service had an adequate supply of PPE to meet current and future demand. Staff were using and disposing of PPE correctly.

The home had arrangements in place to test both people and staff for COVID-19, in line with the current guidelines on testing. People and most staff had received a first dose of the vaccine.

The registered manager was open and pro-active in sharing information with friends and family, so they understood decisions around visiting and restrictions.

People were supported to maintain links with friends and family via telephone and video calls. Links with families were maintained through regular communication and relatives' meetings held online which allowed many relatives including families in other countries to take part.

### Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.
