Our inspection team

Our inspection team was led by a CQC lead inspector. The team included a GP specialist advisor and a practice nurse specialist advisor.

Background to Langham Place Surgery

Langham Place Surgery is located in Northampton on a busy main road. The surgery has good transport links and there is a pharmacy located nearby. Parking is available to patients at the back of the service.

The provider is registered with CQC to deliver the Regulated Activities; diagnostic and screening procedures, family planning, maternity and midwifery services, surgical procedures and treatment of disease, disorder or injury.

Langham Place Surgery is situated within the Nene Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and provides services to 10,150 patients under a General Medical Services (GMS) contract, which is a nationally agreed contract between general practices and NHS England.

The provider is made up of two female GP partners and two male GP partners. The practice employs a salaried GP, a team of nurses, health care assistants and a phlebotomist, three paramedics and an administrative and reception team. The practice is part of a local Primary Care Network.

The area served is slightly more deprived compared to England as a whole. The practice population is mostly white British with notable communities from Central and Eastern Europe and some Asian and African countries. The practice serves a below average older population. This is partly due to the large local student population at the University of Northampton.
