Summary of findings

Overall summary

Reevy Road Care Home is a residential care home providing accommodation and personal care for up to 24 people with a learning disability and autistic people. At the time of this inspection 15 people were using the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

Visitors were tested on arrival or had to present a negative COVID-19 test which was completed just before they arrived at the service. There was signage to explain what everyone should do to ensure infection control measures were followed.

Alternative forms of maintaining social contact were used for friends and relatives who were unable to visit; for example: keeping in touch using video and telephone calls.

The service had effective processes in place so clothes were laundered safely.

PPE was situated throughout the building and staff were observed wearing appropriate PPE.

Staff received training around infection prevention and only worked in this service, to reduce the risk of transmission of the COVID-19 virus.

The service had an Infection Prevention and Control policy that was up to date and had been audited during the pandemic to reflect best practice.
