Summary of findings

Overall summary

Summerdyne Nursing Home is a residential care home providing personal and nursing care for up to 27 people aged 18 and over. At the time of the inspection 23 people were using the service.

We found the following examples of good practice.

- Arrangements were in place for safe visiting, with an area with direct access to the outside of the home. People were also supported to maintain contact with window visits and the use of video calls. with their friends and relatives through telephone and video calling.
- The provider admitted people to the service safely and followed best practice guidance, such as testing and self-isolating on admission.
- The registered manager had purchased an ultraviolet light kit (highlights germs) to show staff which areas of their hands had been missed when washing and which surfaces require regular cleaning.
- PPE was available and used by staff at all times. There were forms visitors had completed to record their COVID-19 test results as negative before entering the home.
- People and staff in the home had regular testing for COVID-19 and all people had received their first vaccine.

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 as part of our regulatory functions. This inspection was planned to check whether the provider is meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Health and Social Care Act 2008.

As part of CQC's response to the coronavirus pandemic we are looking at the preparedness of care homes in relation to infection prevention and control. This was a targeted inspection looking at the infection control and prevention measures the provider has in place.
