Why we carried out this inspection

We carried out this inspection in line with our inspection priorities and it included all of the key questions: safe, effective, caring, responsive and well-led.

How we carried out the inspection

This inspection was carried out in a way which enabled us to spend a minimum amount of time on site.

This included:

- Conducting staff interviews using video conferencing.
- Completing clinical searches on the practice's patient records system (this was with consent from the provider and in line with all data protection and information governance requirements).
- Reviewing patient records to identify issues and clarify actions taken by the provider.
- Requesting evidence from the provider.
- A short site visit.
- Staff questionnaires

Our findings

We found that:

- The practice provided care in a way that kept patients safe and protected them from avoidable harm.

Our inspection team

Our inspection team was led by a CQC lead inspector who spoke with staff using video conferencing facilities and undertook a site visit. The team included a GP specialist advisor who spoke with staff using video conferencing facilities and completed clinical searches and records reviews without visiting the location.

Background to Dr Maya Mistry & Dr Smitesh Patel

Dr Maya Mistry and Dr Smitesh Patel is known locally as Greenwood Surgery and is located in South Woodham Ferrers in Chelmsford at:

The provider is registered with CQC to deliver the Regulated Activities; diagnostic and screening procedures, maternity and midwifery services, family planning, treatment of disease, disorder or injury and surgical procedures.

The practice is situated within the Mid and South Essex Integrated Care System (ICS) and delivers General Medical Services (GMS) patient population of about 6,800. This is part of a contract held with NHS England.

The practice is part of a wider network of GP practices in the Dengie and South Woodham Ferrers Primary Care Network (PCN), which is made up of 8 GP practices. Dr Smitesh Patel is the clinical director for the PCN.

Information published by Public Health England shows that deprivation within the practice population group is in the lowest decile. The data is ranked 1-10, with 1 being the most deprived and 10 being the least deprived. This practice is rated as 10.

According to the latest available data, the ethnic make-up of the practice area is 96.8% White, 3.6% Asian, 0.6% Black, 1.1% Mixed, 0.2 Other.

There is a team of 2 GP partners, one of whom is the registered manager. There is also 1 locum GP. The practice has a team of 2 part-time advanced nurse practitioners, 1 part-time practice nurse, 2 part-time healthcare assistants, a practice manager and an assistant practice manager, supported by a team of secretaries, administrators and receptionists. The practice also employs allied healthcare professionals from the PCN.

The practice is open between 8 am to 6.30 pm Monday to Friday. The practice offers a range of appointment types including book on the day, telephone consultations and advance appointments.

Extended access is available at a local practice, where late evening and weekend appointments are available. Out of hours services are provided by NHS 111.

Information published by Public Health England shows that deprivation within the practice population group is in the second lowest decile (two of 10). The lower the decile, the more deprived the practice population is relative to others.

According to the latest available data, the ethnic make-up of the practice area is 57% Asian, 21% White, 15% Black, 4% Mixed, and 3% Other.

The age distribution of the practice population closely mirrors the local and national averages.
