Summary of findings

Overall summary

About the service

Clasper Court is an extra care housing service. People using this service lived in their own apartment within one large building. The building comprises of 24 individual apartments.

We found the following examples of good practice:

- All visitors had to undergo a temperature check before entry. There were ample PPE and handwashing facilities available, as well as clear signage. Staff had worked flexibly and creatively to facilitate compassionate visits.
- Staff had responded positively to external advice regarding infection prevention and control. They had reacted proactively, for instance sourcing clip-on pens and hand sanitisers to reduce touching items unnecessarily.
- The service had facilitated video calls and window visits in line with national guidance.
- Movement of staff and people between services had been minimised. Staff had worked additional shifts and helped with cleaning duties to ensure people were safe and received a continuity of care.
- The registered manager and other leaders understood national guidance and ensured that the extra care service provision had a clear set of policies and procedures in place.

Detailed findings

Background to this inspection

We carried out this inspection under Section 60 of the Health and Social Care Act 2008 (the Act) as part of our regulatory functions. We checked whether the provider was meeting the legal requirements and regulations associated with the Act.

As part of CQC's response to care services with outbreaks of COVID-19, we are conducting reviews to ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control practice was safe and the service was compliant with IPC measures. This was a targeted inspection looking at the IPC practices the provider has in place.

This inspection took place on 16 February 2021 and was announced.
